

*Government Notice No. 50 of 2003***THE CONSUMER PROTECTION
(PRICE AND SUPPLIES CONTROL) ACT****Regulations made by the Minister under section 35 of the
Consumer Protection (Price and Supplies Control) Act**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Consumer Protection (Trade Fair and Exhibition) Regulations 2003.

2. In these regulations—

“exhibition” means a commercial event of limited duration at a specific place where participants are allowed to exhibit their products and services;

“trade fair” means a commercial event of limited duration at a specific place where participants are allowed both the exhibit and to sell their products and services;

“applicant” means a person, company or organisation applying for authorisation to hold a trade fair or exhibition.

3. (1) Any person wishing to hold a trade fair or an exhibition shall make an application to the Minister four months in advance in the form set out in the Schedule.

(2) Where a trade fair or exhibition entails the participation of any non-citizen no application shall be considered unless the applicant has obtained the prior written approval of the Prime Minister's Office and attached same to his application.

4. (1) No trade fair or exhibition shall be held unless the Minister has given his written authorisation upon an application made under regulation 3.

(2) No authorisation shall be given for the holding of a trade fair or exhibition at any time during the month of December.

5. The Minister may grant an application subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, or may reject the application.

6. The Consumer Protection (Trade Fair and Exhibition) Regulations 2003 are revoked.
