ANNEX TO THE INTERVENTION OF THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND HUMAN RESOURCES ON THE BUDGET ON TUESDAY 08 NOVEMBER 2011

SECTION 1: PRE-PRIMARY SECTOR

1. NATIONAL CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK (NCF)

In line with the NCF, a Manual of Activities is being produced to help school educators with guidelines for planning, designing, implementing and assessing pedagogical activities and also empowering them to engage in innovative pedagogical practices through the development of contextualized and culturally appropriate Mauritian stories, songs, poems & other creative activities. Audio visual materials and DVD's are also being developed.

2. TRAINING / WORKSHOP/EXHIBITIONS HELD IN YEAR 2011

- (i) Strengthening Professionalization in Early Childhood Care;
- (ii) Good Eating Habits;
- (iii) Value Based Parental Empowerment Program;
- (iv) production of teaching & learning aids;
- (v) 177 value-based parental empowerment programmes;
- (vi) the importance and richness of science; and
- (vii) Child Rights and Responsibilities

3. IT LITERACY

E-Inclusion Foundation donated 250 computers for ECCEA schools and 500 Computers for schools in deprived areas.

4. SURVEY ON PRIVATE PRE-PRIMARY SCHOOLS

The ECCEA has carried out a national survey on the status of private preschools in Mauritius. The evaluation and analysis of the data is ongoing and based on the report a short and long term strategic plan will be devised with a view to ensure equity between all preschools.

5. TEACHER EDUCATION & TEACHER TRAINING

The following courses are run by MIE/MCA/UTM:

- (i) Certificate of Proficiency in Early Childhood Development;
- (ii) the Training of some 185 educators in Linux;
- (iii) Teachers' Diploma in Early Childhood Education;

- (iv) 274 ECCEA and private educators are following the Teachers' Diploma in Early Childhood Education (2 years).
- (v) Certificate of Proficiency in the Management of ECD Services

6. CONSTRUCTION

Five pre-primary schools namely at Belle Mare, Palma, Barkly, Duperre, and Bambous have been constructed in 2011 and will be operational as from January 2012.

7. NEW REGULATIONS

New Regulations have been promulgated in September 2011, providing for the setting up of Child Minding Services in both Public and Private Pre-schools and the modalities for the registration of the private pre-schools as well as their staff.

SECTION 2: PRIMARY SECTOR

1. HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

(i) Breathing and Stretching

In order to foster a culture of good health and lifelong wellness through physical activities, children at primary level are initiated from an early stage to simple breathing and stretching exercises. Some of the activity periods are being fully utilized as from this year to enhance the sports related potential of students. A CD on breathing and stretching was prepared by this Ministry in collaboration with Mauritius College of the Air (MCA) and distributed to all primary schools including Rodrigues.

(ii) Vision Screening

Vision screening started in 2007 in primary schools and was carried out in collaboration with NGOs. Many pupils in primary schools were thus detected with preventable vision problems. The exercise was later on carried out also by Ministry of Health & Quality of Life. The practice was continued by Health & PE Educators. Moreover, MEDCO Teachers were trained in October 2011 to carry out vision screening.

(iii) Other Sport Activities

(a) FIFA Grassroot Football project

FIFA Grassroot Football project is being implemented in primary schools and organized jointly by Ministry of Youth & Sports, Ministry of Education and Human Resources and Mauritius Football Association since year 2009. The aim of the project is to promote football activity in primary schools, to increase the awareness of educational values of football, to foster social interaction and to contribute to a healthy development of the young children of the country.

As at October 2011, around 9000 pupils (boys pupils aged 10-11 years and girls pupils aged 8-9 years) participated in the above programme.

(b) FIFA Football for Health project

At the Secondary level, the FIFA Football for Health project is being implemented in all secondary schools (State & private) at Form I level. It is being organized jointly by Ministry of Youth and Sports, Ministry of Education and Human Resources and Mauritius Football Association. The project started in 2010 on a pilot basis in 11 secondary schools and in 2011, it has been extended to 163 secondary schools covering some 17,000 students. The objective of the project is to convey 11 health messages by playing football.

2. ROAD SAFETY

The Ministry has worked in close collaboration with the Traffic Management and Road Safety Unit (TMRSU) for the sensitization of children on road safety.

(i) Activity Book for Standards III and IV

An Activity Book has been prepared for Standards III and IV of Primary Schools. A panel has been set up at the MIE and is working on the preparation of an Activity Book for Standards V and VI.

(ii) Road Safety Talks in Secondary Schools

Talks have been carried out in a large number of secondary schools. The use of power point presentations and the projection of video clips have helped in the sensitization of the students on various road safety issues.

(iii) Meetings with students of Health Clubs

Meetings have been held in all Educational Zones with representatives of Health Clubs of Secondary Schools. Road Safety Clubs would be set up within the Health Clubs to empower the students as Road Safety Officers. The TMRSU has noted the contact details of the students with a view to communicating with them in the future.

(iv) Seat belt campaign

In the context of the seat belt campaign, CDs, leaflets and posters have been distributed to the Road Safety Clubs of each State and Private Secondary School where such a body has been set up.

3. PEDAGOGICAL PROGRAMMES

(i) Enhancement Programme: The Ministry has introduced an Enhancement Programme for pupils of Standard IV in primary schools as from 17 February 2010. Given the success of the programme at the level of Standard IV, it has been extended to Standard III and to Asian and Arabic Languages in 2011. The Programme covers pedagogical aspects by reinforcing work in the core subjects and is supported by a diversity of extracurricular activities such as drama, sports, physical education, music, painting, SLAM and others. A new learning mode whereby differentiated pedagogical techniques are applied helps attend to the varied learning needs of children. The programme will be reinforced through inclusion of, *inter-alia*, a strategy of mixed ability teaching and digital literacy so as to promote a culture of success at all levels. The services of some 982 Educators were enlisted for the academic and pedagogical component of the Programme. A pool of 582 Resource Persons with valuable expertise in their relevant fields catered for the co- and extra-curricular activities. Annual competitions at national and regional levels have been organized in the co- and extra-curricular activities, namely, Quiz, Elocution, Poem Recitation, Story Telling, Dictation, Slam, Drama, Painting, Drawing and Music at School, Zonal and National Levels. An Award Ceremony and Mega Show will be held on 5 December 2011 to reward the four best participants selected for each activity at National Level. Portfolio of students for Standards III and IV will be introduced as from beginning of next year such that parents can follow up on the learning progress of their wards.

(ii) Diagnostic Assessment: After two years of schooling, a Diagnostic Assessment test is carried out for all primary schools pupils in Standard III.

This exercise has helped the teachers of the Standard III classes to identify the learning deficits and plan remedial actions accordingly. It gears towards assessing the amount of learning mastered in Standards I and II. As a result of this test, the Remedial Education project has been initiated in Standard III in 21 schools which are more at risk of failures.

(iii) Continuous Assessment:

This project has been implemented in Standards III and IV. The learner's performance has been assessed on a regular and systematic basis and learning gaps have been addressed. Parents have also been informed of the progress of the child.

(iv) Remedial Education: In the context of this project, specialised teams have been set up to provide the pedagogical support required at the level of the school. A system of individualized support to children with learning difficulties at Standards III and IV has been introduced. 20 Remedial Support Teachers have been recruited to assist these children for mainstream purposes.

(v) The CPE Repeaters' Project: This project has been initiated in schools as from April 2011 to catch up for what has been missed by pupils as from Standard III. Teachers worked on the respective syllabus for one month for Standard III, one month for Standard IV and one month for Standard V. Some 3,000 pupils have been involved in 154 CPE Repeaters' classes island wide, this year.

(vi) Zone D'Education Prioritaire (ZEP) - The ZEP strategy aims at combating social inequalities by providing equal opportunities to all primary school children of the country. One of the major achievements for the ZEP Project has been a reduction in the absenteeism rate from 15.7 % in 2007 to 11.7 % in 2010. CPE Pass rate increased from 30.9 % in 2003 and reached 36.2 % in 2010.

The Ministry is in the process of reviewing the ZEP Strategy in an aim to sustain good practices, replicate support for children who are in need and improve on the indicators.

4. CURRICULUM INITIATIVES

(i) Textbooks

With new textbooks for the Standard VI in schools this year, the Ministry has completed the cycle of production of new pedagogical materials based on the new curriculum framework for primary schools. Books with enlarged scripts have also been produced for children with visual impairment.

(ii) Sexuality Education

Sexuality Education is already embedded into the new primary school textbooks and a Teacher's Guide has been prepared, whereas at the Secondary level, sexuality education is covered in subjects as Integrated Science, Health and Physical Education and Biology. Additional sensitization programmes are also carried out by partners like such as Action Familiale and Mauritius Family Planning Association and Ministries concerned.

Furthermore in August 2011, training workshops on Sexuality Education and Prevention of Sexual Abuse were organized for Head Masters in collaboration with line Ministries and other stakeholders. This will be followed up with a survey to be carried out by the Ministry on the Sexual and Reproductive Health needs of students in secondary schools in 2012. The results of the survey will be used for policy making in this area.

(iii) Introduction of Kreol Morisien and Bhojpuri

- A National Forum was organized on 30 August 2010 on the introduction of 'Kreol Morisien' as an optional subject in schools.
- Following the Forum, the "Akadémi Kreol Morisien' (AKM) was set up administratively to look into all aspects related to the introduction of Kreol Morisien in schools along with, *inter alia*, a harmonized version of its written form.
- The AKM has finalized the standardized writing system entitled 'LORTOGRAF KREOL MORISIEN' in February 2011 and has produced a document on Grammar entitled 'Gramer kreol Morisien" in May 2011. The 'Diksioner Morisien' has been launched in September 2011.

- Some 3487 pupils have opted to study this language which is being introduced in Std I as from 2012.
- Some 84 teachers have opted for the teaching of Kreol Morisien including 13 from Rodrigues and training is being carried out at the level of MIE for the period August 2011 to November 2011.
- A Stakeholder's Forum on Bhojpuri was held in October 2010 about the introduction of Bhojpuri. Following discussions, it has been decided that oral components of the Bhojpuri language will be taught in Std I in 2012 through the use of songs, poems, rhythms and stories

SECTION 3: SECONDARY SECTOR

1. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Examinable subject at Ordinary Level

- Physical Education has been introduced as an examinable subject at School Certificate/'O' level as from 2010 in 14 secondary schools (8 SSSs, 4 Private, the MGSS Moka and the RTSS). A first batch of 188 students took part in the examinations in November 2011.
- In 2012, Physical Education at SC/'O' level is being extended to 39 additional secondary schools (17 SSSs + 22 private) satisfying the criteria for the minimum requirement (i.e. more than 18 students in a school for the introduction of the subject).

Examinable subject at Advanced Subsidiary Level

- Physical Education will be introduced at Advanced Subsidiary (AS) level in 14 pilot secondary schools as from 2012.

2. HEALTH & ANTI DRUG EDUCATION

In 2011 the Ministry has worked closely with the Ministry of Health & Quality of Life, the Ministry of Youth & Sports, the Ministry of Gender Equality to respond to issues like HIV/AIDS, Oral Health, School Health Programme, Substance Abuse Prevention, Communicable Diseases and Non Communicable Diseases like mosquito borne diseases. Sensitization programmes have been carried out with the help of the above stakeholders and NGO's concerned.

3. PROMOTION OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Science for All

"Science For All" as a subject was introduced in 2009 in 14 pilot schools and the first batch of students sat for School certificate examinations in 2010. The subject will be extended to 20 schools in 2012. The objective is to broaden students' outlook, enabling them to cope with today's multidisciplinary environment of the world of work. This has provided an opportunity for students not reading for any pure Science to study the subject and those opting for pure Science to study either of Literature and Social Science.

4. CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT FOR LOWER SECONDARY

For the first time a common syllabus for lower secondary has been worked out and sent to schools in January 2011. This syllabus is based on the new Secondary Curriculum Framework for the Secondary Sector. This will assist all schools in ensuring a standard level of competencies in all subjects.

5. FORM III NATIONAL ASSESSMENT

A National Assessment for Form III students has been piloted again this year, and this assessment has involved 139 secondary schools, both State and Private as well as in Rodrigues. This initiative will be rolled out to all schools in 2012. The subjects being examined are English, French, Mathematics, Computer Literacy/Studies and Science.

6. STANDARDISATION OF TEXTBOOKS

The Ministry has reviewed the current policy on standardization of textbooks for the secondary school sector by empowering schools to prescribe textbooks according to new guidelines and parameters set by the Ministry.

Henceforth, Heads of Schools will be called upon to prescribe textbooks for their own students taking into consideration their level of ability and learning aptitudes. The implementation of the new measure will involve a new monitoring mechanism for prescription of new books and new guidelines have been issued to schools.

7. NEW BOOK SCHEME FOR NEEDY STUDENTS

Government has agreed to a new formula for provision of books to needy students in the secondary sector in replacement of the Book Loan Scheme. According to the current practice, textbooks for needy students are being purchased in bulk by the Ministry and the PSSA. They are being provided to needy students on the basis of a recommended list. These students were required to return the used textbooks after examination results.

Henceforth, each school will be authorized to purchase prescribed textbooks for its own needy students directly from the bookshops and issue the books to students who will retain same for reference purposes.

About 6,700 needy students will benefit from this measure and students this year will not have to return their used books. The new measure will cost Government some Rs 8.5 M annually.

8. EX-REDUNDANT EDUCATORS OF PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS OF 1983

Following the request made by the Union of Private Secondary Education Employees (UPSEE) to the Minister of Education and Human Resources, to consider the case of the Ex-Redundant Educators of 1983 who had in 1983 been paid an allowance in lieu of salary equivalent to their December 1982 salary without the normal increment payable in 1983, the matter was taken up with the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development and the Attorney General's Office.

It has been decided that the salaries of those 1983 Redundant Educators be adjusted hypothetically with a cut off date of January 2008 and arrears for period January 2008 to date be also paid. This decision concerns some 60 Ex-Redundant Educators of 1983 who are in post and those who were in service in January 2008 at MEDCO.

This measure which is being implemented by the Ministry through PSSA costs about Rs 11.4m.

SECTION 4: ICT IN EDUCATION

1. ICT IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS

Sankoré Project

(i) Installation

- Agreement between Ministry of Education and Human Resources & DIENA on 22 December 2010
- Agreement between Para School (France) and MIE on 14 February 2011
- Interactive equipment received at Ministry in April 2011
- All equipment installed by July 2011 in Primary schools

(ii) Training

- Induction courses to Head Masters, Deputy Head Masters and Inspectors in April 2011
- Training of some 700 Std IV educators and ICT Educators in July- August 2011 in 8 regional training centres set up islandwise
- Training carried out in Rodrigues on 3-4 November 2011

(iii) Development of digital content:

- Digitization of pedagogical content materials for Std IV has been effected by the Learning Factory at the MIE. Digitization of Std V contents is under way. All lessons are in e-format and ready to use by teachers with focus on the active use of the digital interactive projectors.

(iv) Usage of Interactive Projectors

- Std IV teachers have made use of the interactive projectors with digital pedagogical content materials during 3rd Term 2011

(v) Additional equipment

- 250 additional equipment are expected to be received from France by end of year 2011.

2. ICT IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS

(i) E-Register System

- To reduce truancy and lateness of students of Secondary Schools, an SMS based system has been implemented to inform parents of their wards' absences at schools on daily basis.
- In 2011. the system has been successfully implemented across all SSS along with 13 PSSA colleges as well.
- An SMS Gateway Agreement has been signed with Mauritius Telecom on 16th June 2011 for this service to formalize and facilitate the process of SMS monitoring and sending.

(ii) ADSL for Secondary Schools

- The internet access in all SSS has been upgraded from 512 Kb/s to 2 MB/s.

(iii) Cyber Corners

- The Ministry is in the process of increasing the number of PCs in the school library to enable more students to go online at the same time. 2 PCs have been provided to each school library of all SSSs.

(iv) Survey on ICT in Education and E-Education Plan

- The Ministry, along with the Ministry of ICT, is currently elaborating an e-Education Plan which is expected to be ready by December 2011.
