

**Local Government Service Commission Circular Note No. 57 of 2011**

**Vacancy for the post of Chemical Sprayerman**  
**Municipal Council of Port-Louis**

Applications are invited from serving employees of the Municipal Council of Port-Louis who wish to be considered for appointment as Chemical Sprayerman in that Municipal Council.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in the scale of Rs 8000 x 200 - 10200 x 250 - 11700 x 300 - 12600 a month plus salary compensation at approved rates.

Appointment to the grade in a temporary capacity carries a flat salary of Rs 8000 a month plus salary compensation at approved rates.

**2. Qualifications :**

*By selection on the basis of experience and merit of employees having a minimum aptitude in the job.*

**Note: Candidates should enclose photocopies of their National Identity Card, academic/technical qualifications and where applicable, relevant documentary evidence of experience claimed.**

**3. Duties :**

1. To mix insecticides/herbicides used for the spraying of buildings, drains, riverbanks, etc.
2. To carry out the spraying;
3. To maintain and take proper care of the spraying apparatus;
4. To clean his sprayer and its accessories at the end of every working day;
5. To perform weeding work when not busy with the spraying apparatus;
6. To perform other cognate duties.

#### 4. Mode of Application

**Note 3:** Candidates should enclose photocopies of their academic/professional qualifications and National Identity Card and where applicable, relevant documentary evidence of experience claimed.

**Note 4:** Acknowledgement of application will be made as far as possible by e-mail.

(ii) Candidates should submit their applications in duplicate, the original should be sent directly to the **Secretary** of the Local Government Service Commission and the duplicate one to their Responsible Officer, who will forward it to the Commission within a week after the closing date
