

The training session organized by the Tourism Authority for skippers consists of a module on environment protection. Skippers are sensitized on the necessity of safeguarding our marine resources.

The following is highlighted:

1. Going aground or stranding on the reefs will damage not only your boat but also the coral reefs.
2. Proceed through the pass with extreme caution.
3. Do not drop anchor on the reefs and do not use the anchor of grapnel type.
4. Dumping garbage into the sea is prohibited. Garbage to be collected and disposed ashore.
5. Collecting corals and shells is prohibited by Law. Advise passengers as well.
6. Speeding will create big waves which are liable to damage the shore.
7. Use permanent buoys for mooring of boats.
8. Use precautionary measures to avoid oil-spills.
9. In case of oil-spills, inform the Ministry of Environment and National Development Unit and the National Coast Guard.
10. Boats are to be painted with paints which will not affect marine life.
11. Chemical products must not be used and discharged at sea.
