Dr Frédéric Jenny is one of the leading world authorities on competition policy. He is a respected academic economist who also sits as a judge and as a decision-maker on the Board of the OFT, the UK competition agency. He was closely involved in the establishment of what is now Autorité de la Concurrence in France and served as its Vice-President from 1993 to 2004.

Current positions

- Judge at the Commercial, Economic and Financial Law Chamber of the Supreme Court of France (Cour de Cassation).
- Chairman of the Committee on Competition Law and Policy, OECD Competition Committee.
- Member of the Board of the Office of Fair Trading (the largest competition authority in the UK).
- Chairman of WTO group on the interaction between Trade and Competition Policy.

Education

Dr Jenny studied in France and the United States. He has a Phd in Economics from University Paris II, a Master in Economics from Harvard and an M.B.A from ESSEC Business School in Paris. He has taught Economics at ESSEC since 1972. His research areas concern the relationship between market structure and economic performance in European countries (mainly France) and antitrust legislation in Europe.

Publications

Dr Jenny has published books and articles in the area of competition policy, ranging from textbooks to articles on European competition law and, more recently, the importance of competition policy to developing countries and in small economies.
